The very ideas that underpin our traditional understanding of organisation and workplace are being critically explored by an increasingly large number of people. Equally, the discussion is also embracing new ways of thinking about organisation, through a range of perspectives. It as if a new school of organisational thought is appearing in outline and is crying out for closer investigation.

It feels as though this process has been accelerated by our changed global circumstances since 2020. Yet it remains the case that, while many people are drawn to engaging differently with this topic, it remains a discussion that day-to-day corporate life marginalises. This is made easier by the fact that the voices who are seeking to unravel the common place and to describe new ways of being in organisational life are rarely heard as a collective.

Here is a chance for all with an interest in critically exploring and radically rethinking the workplace —both practitioners and scholars—to come together not as a conference but as a rich conversational exchange amongst peers.

This is a full day event in a country setting in Bedfordshire. We are pleased to advise that discounted local hotel rooms will be available for registered participants for the evening of Thursday 9 June 2022.

The *Re-organising Organisation Colloquium* (ROC) offers an open space for those who are eager to engage in this debate and to offer new ways of thinking about the world of work . It is intended that the event will bring together 40 people who will use their time together as a co-operative inquiry. There also exists the potential that a collective response to the wider debate might arise from the conversations—although this is not the main focus of the event.

The time together will allow people to explore:

- * *Organisational philosophy;*
- * *Reflections on lived experience in organisational life; and*
- * *New ways of thinking about organising in practice.*
